In order to begin receiving these services, please complete the following steps:

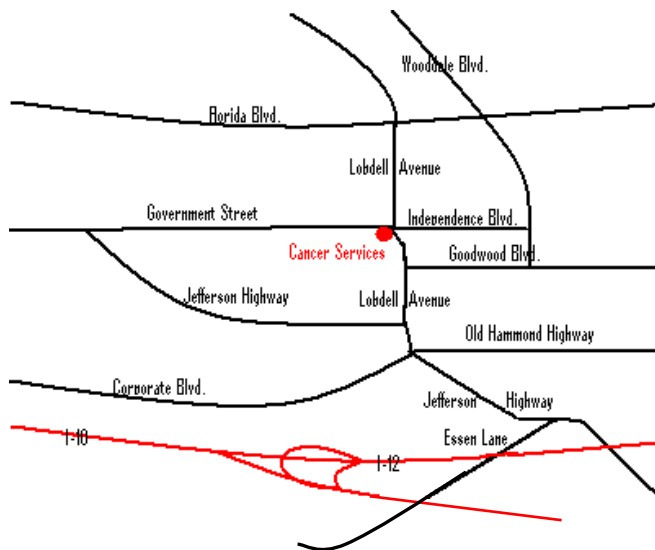
- 1) Complete an Application for Services form (included with this letter).
- 2) Obtain written confirmation of your cancer diagnosis from your doctor or social worker (e.g. a pathology report or a physician's note).

NOTE: *If your doctor or social worker completes the referral section of the "Application for Services" form, it will serve as proof of diagnosis.*

- 3) Bring the completed Application for Services form and proof of diagnosis to Cancer Services and meet briefly with a staff member at our main location on Lobdell Avenue between the hours of 8:30 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Monday-Friday. You may also meet with a staff member at the following Outreach Sites:
 - a. Mary Bird Perkins Cancer Center – 2nd floor: 9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. Monday-Friday and 2:00 p.m.-4:00 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday
 - b. Earl K. Long Medical Center – Every Thursday
 - c. Pennington Cancer Center – Every Friday

If you are interested in scheduling an appointment at our Earl K. Long or Pennington Outreach Sites, please contact us for further information.

Please note that while all services are free-of-charge, some services are based on income eligibility guidelines. In order to receive these services, income documentation is required. Income eligibility guidelines will be discussed in depth when you visit.



The main location of Cancer Services is at 550 Lobdell Avenue in Baton Rouge. This is at the intersection of Government Street and Lobdell Avenue, across from the Independence Fire Station.
